

What jobs are there in Dance?

- Performer
- Choreographer
- Dance Teaching Schools sector / Private Dance Schools / Community Dance Practitioner / Dance Lecturer or Academic Researcher
- Dance Project Co-ordinator or Administrator
- Dance/Arts Officer
- Lighting Designer/Technical Production
- Costume / Set Designer
- Dance Producer
- Dance Photographer / Film Maker / Journalist
- Composer for Dance
- Dance Scientist
- Dance Movement Therapist
- Physiotherapy / Osteopathy
- Health & Fitness e.g. Pilates, Yoga, Personal Trainer





Where to study?

- University
- Performing Arts Vocational Training School
- Dance Conservatoire

There are several key differences between conservatoire study and university.

Conservatoires tend to be small institutions who are focused on just one or more specific areas of study; such as music, dance and drama. They will therefore have specialist teaching and facilities dedicated to these areas.

Universities tend to be much larger and will often offer a broad range of courses which could include anything from maths and engineering to art, history and music.

What is the difference between University & Conservatoire?

University

- Fee / loans
- Dance degree / joint dance degree
- Dance studios on a university campus
- 4-5 dance classes a week
- Meet people studying different subjects
- Normally would require further training for a career as a professional dancer
- Part time job

Dance Conservatoire

- Fee / loans
- Dance degree
- Specialist dance facilities
- 3-4 dance classes a day
- Train 5 days a week
- Surrounded by people who are passionate about dance
- Contact with dance professionals
- Professional Dance Training





Applying for Courses

Three main ways of applying:

- 1. UCAS (University courses)
- 2. UCAS Conservatoires (Trinity Laban)
- 3. Direct applications (The Place, Northern & Rambert / Performing Arts Schools such as Bird College, Urdang Academy)
- Apply early!
- Do your research for each institution
- Check what each application requires
- Check what each requires in terms of pre-requisite for grades
- e.g. Trinity Laban is 2 A levels at E or above
- Allow enough time before the deadlines!

DEADLINE: Wed 26 January 2022 – 6pm

What needs to be done by these dates?

- You'll need to leave enough time to complete your application, resolve any queries and make sure it reaches us by the deadline.
- After you find courses and you're ready to apply, you will need to:
- Fill in your details, qualifications and course choices.
- Write a personal statement to demonstrate you'll be a good student.
- Include your reference and pay your application fee.
- The application fee is £22 if you're applying to just one course, or £26.50 for 2-5 courses.



sonal statement top tips...

- by linking experience from your studies and othe activities to the course.
- 2: be honest don't be tempted to exaggerate.
 Admissions tutors often refer to personal statements during interviews.
- 3: start early you'll probably redraft it several times before you're happy with it, so allow yourself plenty of time.
- 4: let friends and family read it they may have suggestions you haven't considered and can tell you whether it makes sense.
- 5: proofread it several times reading it out loud will help you to spot bad punctuation and messy wording.

What happens after I apply for a fee waiver?

Applications will be processed every four weeks (outcome dates are on the website)

You will be able to apply online from Friday 1st October 2021

Paper forms and other formats are available on request. Please email info@cdd.ac.uk to request a copy.

To be eligible, applicants must:

- Be a UK resident
- Be applying for an undergrad programme
- Have no previous first degree qualification
- Have a household income of £25,000 or under before tax
